

Notebook Requirements : World History

We will be keeping notebooks in class to build a portfolio of historical work. All homework, class work and notes will be placed in the notebook. Bring your notebook to class every day.

School Wide Notebooks: You will be keeping two notebooks for all of your classes at Foothill, one for your even periods (periods 2, 4 & 6) and another for your odd periods (periods 1, 3, & 5).

- Please have a divider labeled “World History” in the appropriate notebook.
- Also please have dividers for history titled :
 - Completed notebook pages
 - Homework
 - Essays
 - Tests/ quizzes
- Notebooks will be checked at the end of each unit.

Final Notebooks (each semester)

- You are required to keep a 2 inch notebook at home with all past, graded units.
- At the end of both first and second semester you will be required to bring this home history notebook to school, with all completed units. You can receive a total of 10 pts. per notebook organized in the binder. Your grade for each notebook will be determined by the grade you originally received on the notebook. For example, if you earn a solid B (85%) on the notebook, you will earn 8.5/10 for that portion of the semester notebook.

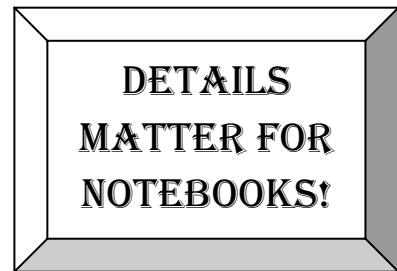
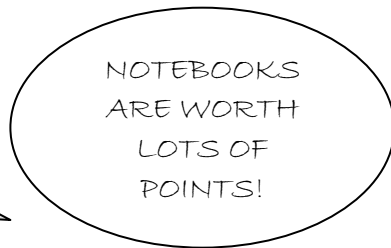
Reviewing for unit assessments: *You will receive a review sheet for each unit and you will use your notebook to review. You will be graded on how well you review your notebook materials.*

- **Highlighting** – you will go through all homework assignments and lecture notes and highlight the following in the stated colors:
 - **Yellow - key terms** – these are terms that are key ideas from this unit. Each page from your outlines and lecture notes should contain at least 3 highlighted key terms.
 - **Pink - people involved** – these are people who were influential during this time period. Each page from your outlines and lectures should have at least 1 highlighted key person
- **Post-it Notes** – You will include a post-it note on SOME pages in your notebook (excluding warm-ups). This post-it must contain a paragraph summary of the assignment (at least 4 sentences) describing the following:
 - How the assignment relates to the “bigger picture” of the historical time period or a specific question.

Grading : Homework assignments will be stamped for completeness when due or collected and graded on the due date. These assignments, even those already graded, need to be kept in the notebook. Notebooks will be collected at the end of each unit, usually on the day of the unit test. Each unit notebook will be worth a different amount of points as each unit may contain different assignments.

Units – Each unit in the notebook must contain the following :

- Typed Title Page – contains:
 - title of the unit
 - unit number (Unit 3)
 - unit question
 - author's name (you)
 - standards for that unit (can be found on the course web-site)
 - an image (drawn or digital) that represents the content of the unit.
- Typed Table of contents – The table of contents must be listed in the correct order. A table of contents for each unit is available on the course web-site. The table of contents must include the page number for each assignment. Each unit does NOT start page numbering over. For example, if Unit 1 finishes on page 14, Unit 2 starts on page 15. Title pages and the table of contents should not be numbered. Numbers need to be placed on pages in the bottom right hand corner of each page.
